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COLLEGE HISTORY

Ever since the British period, the twin towns of Tirunelveli and Palayamkottai, intersected by the perennial Tamiraparani River, have been great centres of learning. The Tirunelveli District has a sizable Muslim population which felt the need for an Institution of Higher Education. Due to the dedicated and sincere efforts of the Muslim elite, a College of Arts and Sciences, named after the noted Arabic Scholar Sadakathullah Appa, was started in 1971.

The foundation stone was laid by Janab Syed Abdul Wahab Buhari Sahib. M.A.L.T., Rector, Madrasa Jamalia, Madras on 5.02.1971 (8th Dhul - Haj 1390). The College was inaugurated by Alhaj. M. Mohammed Ismail Sahib (the then President at Indian Union Muslim League) on 4.08.1971 in the presence of former Education Minister Honourable V.R. Neduncheliyan, and Dr. Mu. Varadarasanar, former Vice - Chancellor of Madurai Kamaraj University.

The College is located on a 40 acre sprawling campus. It was first affiliated to the Madurai Kamaraj University for twenty years. With the birth of the Manonmaniam Sundaranar University in 1990, the College was affiliated to it. It is run by the SADAKATHULLAH APPA EDUCATIONAL SOCIETY.

The College offers Undergraduate (U.G.) programmes in Tamil, Arabic, English, History, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Computer Science, Computer Application, Information Technology, Artificial Intelligence and Data Science, Microbiology, Nutrition and Dietetics, Commerce, Commerce Finance, Commerce Hons., Business Administration, Psychology and Economics besides a one year programme B.Lib.I.Sc. The College offers Postgraduate (P.G.) programmes in English, History, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Computer Science, Microbiology, Commerce and Nutrition and Dietetics. M.Phil programmes are offered by the Departments of English, History, Mathematics, Physics, Computer Science and Commerce and Ph.D. programmes are offered by the Departments of English, History, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Microbiology, Computer Science and Commerce. Apart from this, the College has 18 certificate courses and 1 diploma course. Typewriting, Tailoring and Bridge Course in English are the other courses offered to the students to equip themselves with extra skills needed for placements.

Under Sadakath Academy, Short-Term Career-Oriented courses such as Chartered Accountancy (CPT and Intermediate), Cost and Management Accountant (Foundation Course and Intermediate) and Company Secretary (Foundation Course and Intermediate) are offered from the academic year 2016-2017. Coaching classes for SET, NET and Competitive Examinations are conducted on the campus.

Every year, the Placement Cell conducts on and off campus drives and supports students in terms of recruitments.

One hundred and five endowments amounting to Rs.40,00,000/- have been sponsored by well-wishers and retired staff. The endowment fund is spent on scholarships, prizes and special lectures. In addition, there are 76 patrons.

The Islamic Study Circle gives scholarships from the Zakat Fund collected from the staff. The Alumni-Association of our College has been a source of support to the growth of the College.

The College runs **Sadakath - A Research Bulletin**, a multidisciplinary research journal, indexed in Google Scholar (ISSN:2347- 7644).

Sadakathullah Appa College is the local centre for NPTEL (National Programme on Technology Enhanced Learning).

The College has introduced many best practices : 'Earn While You Learn' - economically under-privileged students being favoured with part-time jobs at various offices of the College, '**Students' Self-Help Scheme' (SSHS)**, '**Students Help in First Aid' (SHIFA)** and '**Manitham**' - a humanitarian and public spirited movement to provide food and shelter for the abandoned and the mentally-deranged people in and around Tirunelveli.

The Management of Sadakathullah Appa College established the **Sadakath Clinic and Laboratory** on May 2025 for the welfare of the Society.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

GOOD MANNERS AND BEHAVIOUR:

- ★ Every student should conform to the rules and regulations relating to attendance, library, college fees, examinations, etc. Hostel residents must obey the hostel regulations.
- ★ Students are forbidden to smoke on the college premises, to write or make any marks on the walls or to throw paper or ink on the floor of the classrooms or the verandas.
- ★ Students are not allowed to stand or walk in the verandas of the college during class hours.
- ★ Strict silence must be observed during class hours in the classrooms.
- ★ Students are expected to be courteous to all, especially, to their Professors and Elders.
- ★ When a faculty or any other member of the staff enters a classroom, the students must stand and should not remain seated until the staff asks them to do so or they take the seat. They should, likewise, stand up when the staff leaves the classroom.
- ★ No student should leave the classroom during lecture hours without permission of the faculty. Similarly, no student can call out any student from the class without permission from the faculty.

- ★ Any difference that may arise among the students and faculty should be resolved by peaceful methods, and with a spirit of give and take policy. Therefore, students should not address any authority in a collective body. Such an action is subversive to good order. Requests, petitions, appeals and complaints of any kind must be made in the first place to the Head of the Department concerned and never directly to higher authorities.
- ★ College property and furniture should be handled with care and anyone who damages them will be held liable to pay for the damage caused. Stealing of college property or belongings of others constitutes a serious offence and therefore, immediate action will be taken. Lights and fans in the classroom must be switched off when there is no lecture in the class.
- ★ Science students will not be permitted to take away any broken apparatus from the laboratory.
- ★ Two-wheelers should be parked only in the sheds and not anywhere else on the campus.
- ★ Students those who are coming by two-wheelers should have proper license and wear helmet. Students must avoid having more than one pillion rider.
- ★ Students are expected to regularly go through the notices put up on the notice boards. Ignorance of any notice thus displayed will not be accepted as an excuse for failing to comply with the directions contained in it.

DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS

(Cfr. *Tamil Nadu Educational Rules (1973) Nos. 93-98*)

- ❖ Students are forbidden to organise or attend any meetings on the college premises, or collect money for any purpose without explicit permission from the Principal.
- ❖ No student, who has been convicted of any offence in a criminal court, will be allowed to continue his/her studies in the college.
- ❖ Students should abstain themselves from active participation in party or communal politics.
- ❖ Students who indulge in political propaganda or who organise fellow students into political factions on the premises of the college or hostels, or who otherwise engage themselves in party or politics are liable to be expelled from the college and hostels.
- ❖ Under the educational rules of the Tamil Nadu Government (1978) the Principal has full power to inflict the following punishments, if any student is guilty of rudeness of behaviour and gross breach of rules: fine, loss of term certificate, suspension and expulsion from the college.

- ❖ Students should not indulge in any activity leading to the disruption of peace and discipline and dislocation of normal work on the college and hostel premises. Those who are guilty of violation of these will be severely punished.
- ❖ Ragging of any kind is strictly forbidden. Anyone who is guilty of ragging will be summarily and severely punished.
- ❖ Students who are guilty of (i) rude language towards the staff of the College or Hostels (ii) assault or attempt to assault the faculty or fellow students of the College or Hostels will be expelled from the Institution.
- ❖ Students who bring their vehicles to College should produce photocopies of their driving license, vehicle Insurance and RC Book to the College. The same should be kept by those students always for verification by the College authorities.
- ❖ Students should not bring or use mobile phones on the campus. If found possessing mobile phone on the campus, it will be seized and will not be returned. Also, the defaulters will be severely dealt with by the authorities.

In 1971, the year of establishment of the College, the hostel was started. It is named after a philanthropist, Janab Wavoo Shahul Hameed of Kayalpatnam. The mess is run on a dividing system.

HOSTEL (WOMEN)

The College became co-educational in the academic year 1996-'97. Consequently, a Hostel for women became imperative.

Ladies Hostel-I was constructed with the financial assistance from Maulana Abulkalam Azad Educational Foundation, New Delhi. The growing number of girl students every year necessitated the establishment of another Hostel. Eventually, Ladies Hostel-II was constructed with the financial aid from the UGC.

Female students from the aided stream are accommodated in Ladies Hostel - II and those from the unaided stream are accommodated in Ladies Hostel - I.

AUTONOMY

Sadakathullah Appa College was conferred with autonomous status by the UGC and Manonmaniam Sundaranar University on 03.01.2007. Though the College is affiliated to Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, getting autonomous status for an Institution is considered a mark of high esteem, prestige and honour.

Autonomous status elevates the Institution to stand high in the academic arena. It gives not only freedom to the Institution to design curriculum to suit students' needs but also helps the institution to produce patriotic citizens whose primary efforts would be towards acquiring knowledge and skills of Science and Technology, Humanities and Literature.

Autonomy ensures innovative teaching methods, freedom to teachers to design the curriculum, assessment and evaluation. The students, no doubt, will reap the benefit finally.

The financial assistance given by the University Grants Commission is a boon to an Autonomous Institution. The main objective of an Autonomous Institution is to offer quality education.

Sadakathullah Appa College, with the bounteous Grace of the Almighty Allah, successfully reviewed the first extension of the Autonomous status in 2012-13. Subsequently, in 2018-19, the Autonomy Review Committee nominated by the University Grants Commission visited the College for the second Review of the Autonomous status and the Extension of the Autonomous status has been conferred on from 2018-19 to 2022-23. The University Grants Commission has extended the Autonomous Status for a period of 10 years from 2023 - 2033.

CHOICE-BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) is introduced in all Arts and Science colleges in Tamil Nadu from the academic year 2008 - 2009. It gives opportunity for students to choose, join and study simultaneously (along with their own respective programme) a programme from other disciplines. The CBCS facilitates the students to study more useful papers such as Skill-Based Electives and Non-Major Electives. Under the CBCS Pattern, many number of skill-based, career-oriented and interdepartmental courses are offered and credits are awarded.

Extra Credit Courses (ECC), offered outside the regular class hours, add to the credits. The minimum credits to be secured in the UG degree level is 140 and the PG degree is 90. The CBCS System, no doubt, moulds the students fit to be employed at the technological world.

SCHEME OF EXAMINATIONS UNDER CBCS

- The medium of instruction in all the UG and PG Programmes is English and students shall write the CIA Tests and the Semester Examinations in English. CIA Tests consist of two CIA tests with 1 and half an hour duration each and one Model Test of two hour duration. All the CIA Tests are mandatory. Details of marks and duration of examinations for various courses are given in the next page.
- Two assignments for the Undergraduate Programmes and one assignment and one seminar for the Postgraduate Programmes are Mandatory.
- Two Practical Examinations will be conducted for CIA and the average will be taken.
- Special CIA Test will be conducted for absenting students on the payment of prescribed fee.

End Semester Examination (ESE)

The students who have the required number of days of attendance are eligible to appear for the End Semester Examinations irrespective of whether they have passed the CIA Tests or not. They should pay the examination fees for all the current courses and the arrear courses, if any, and submit the application form before the due date announced. Students with arrears can apply for a Maximum of 4 courses in a semester except in the Sixth Semester where the students with arrears can apply for any number of arrear Courses. During Odd Semesters, Odd Semester Courses alone can be written, but during Even Semesters, all Semester Courses can be written.

Attendance Mark

Attendance Mark of 5 will be given based on the proportion of attendance in a Semester on all the Courses including the Practical Courses.

MOOC / NPTEL Examination Pattern:

Marks secured in MOOC / NPTEL Examinations will be converted for 100 marks. If a student cannot pass in MOOC / NPTEL Examinations, special examinations will be conducted in our College on the payment of prescribed fee.

Examination Pattern for Part - V Courses:

Marks for the Part – V Courses are based on the number of activities performed by the students. Maximum Mark will be 100 and Passing minimum for UG Programmes is 40 Marks and for PG Programmes 50 Marks.

Special CIA Test Details and Instructions: (Applicable for the students of UG and PG who joined from the Academic Year 2024-2025)

1. Eligibility for Special CIA Test:

- Students who missed the First or Second CIA Tests or Model Test due to participation in State or National-Level Competitions/Events are eligible for a Special CIA Test.
- Other absentees from the CIA Tests may also apply for the Special CIA Test on the payment of prescribed fee.

2. Fee Exemption Criteria:

- Students who have received Credit of Attendance for participation in State-Level or National-Level Events and Camps conducted under NSS, NCC, and other Part-V activities, including Sports, are exempted from paying the Special CIA Test fees.
- To qualify for this exemption, students must submit Credit of Attendance Letters signed by the Teacher-in-Charge, Head of the Respective Department, Part-V Coordinator, and the Principal.

3. Fees Structure:

- Students without an exemption must pay a fee of Rs. 200 per course to take the Special CIA Test.
- If the number of courses exceeds four in a single CIA cycle, a maximum fee of Rs. 800 will apply.
- Students must pay the prescribed fee as per the above structure to be allowed to take the Special CIA Test.

4. Application Deadline:

- Students must apply and pay the Special CIA Test fees by the day following the end of the Second CIA Test Cycle.

Examination Pattern for Value Added Courses:

Section A (5 x 2 = 10 marks)	Two Questions (Two marks each) will be asked from each Unit. Students must answer 5 out of the 6 questions.
Section B (5 x 4 = 20 marks)	Two Questions (4 marks each) will be asked from each Unit. Students must answer 5 out of 6 questions
Section C (2 x 10 = 20 marks)	One Question (10 marks each) will be asked from each Unit. Students must answer any 2 out of 3 questions

General Guidelines

All theory question papers will generally be set by external examiners. For undergraduate (UG) and career-oriented programs, a single valuation system is followed, while for postgraduate (PG) programs, double valuation is applied.

Students are permitted to write both *Odd Semester and Even Semester arrear courses in the Even Semester. However, **Even Semester arrear courses can only be cleared during the Even Semester and not in the Odd Semester.

* Odd Semester practical arrears must be cleared in the Odd Semester only.

** Even Semester practical arrears must be cleared in the Even Semester only.

A student must complete at least 75% of the practical exercises arranged by the class teacher and submit the corresponding record notebook. Practical examinations will be conducted by both an internal and an external examiner.

The same rules governing theory examinations apply to absentees and students who have failed but wish to retake the practical examinations.

Grievances Regarding Examinations

Any anomaly in the question paper of the Semester Examinations (such as out-of-syllabus questions, incorrect or insufficient data in problems, etc.) must be reported to the Controller of Examinations in writing through the Head of Department (HoD) within 48 hours of the exam. This allows the Controller to investigate and take appropriate remedial actions.

A student is considered to have taken the examination once they receive the question paper, even if the paper contains anomalies. Issues related to the examination (e.g., anomalies in question papers or requests for special supplementary exams) must be submitted to the Controller of Examinations, who will then refer the matter to the Examination Grievances Redressal Committee for further steps.

Malpractice during CIA/Semester Exams

If a student is caught with unauthorized material (e.g., manuscript, printed sheet, or any incriminating items), they will be stopped from writing the exam and asked to provide a written statement. The invigilator or exam squad will confiscate the Hall Ticket, Identity Card, and Answer Script, and submit a report to the Chief Controller of Examinations. This report will then be forwarded to the Controller of Examinations for further action.

The student will appear before the Examination Discipline Committee, which will determine sanctions based on the severity of the malpractice. Possible sanctions range from disqualification from one or more courses to debarment from subsequent semesters, in accordance with the College's malpractice policy.

Failure to appear before the Examination Discipline Committee will result in a fine of Rs. 1,000, and suspension from the College until the student's parents appear. Students caught in malpractice during CIA Tests will be punished according to the malpractice rules.

If malpractice is discovered post-examination, it will be referred to the Examination Discipline Committee for resolution. The malpractice policies of M.S. University and the College's Academic Council will guide the decision-making process.

Awards Committee

After evaluation, the Examination Discipline Committee will meet to decide on sanctions for students found guilty of malpractice. Following this, the results will be reviewed by the Awards Committee and published on the College website.

Revaluation and Retotalling

UG, PG, and M.Phil. students can apply for revaluation of regular/arrear theory courses within five days of result publication. The highest mark obtained in revaluation will be recorded on the mark statement. Students can also request photocopies of their answer scripts upon payment of a fee.

There is no provision for revaluation or retotalling of practicals or project reports for UG, PG, or M.Phil. courses. Fees paid for revaluation or retotalling are non-refundable.

Supplementary Examinations

Supplementary Examinations are available only to final-year regular students (not private students) who have arrears in no more than two theory courses across all semesters. Students must apply within three days of the revaluation results to be eligible.

Final-year students who were absent or failed in the regular final semester exams can write a maximum of two theory courses in the supplementary exams. Students with arrears from earlier semesters (UG I-V, PG I-III, M.Phil. I) must have appeared and received a fail grade in the final semester to qualify for the supplementary exams.

Only two theory courses can be attempted in the supplementary exams. No supplementary exams are offered for practicals.

Mark Statements

Mark Statements will be distributed in the respective departments on a date announced by the Controller of

Examinations. Students must bring their parents to collect the mark statements. Upon completion of the program, a consolidated mark statement will be issued.

Students can apply for a duplicate or consolidated mark statement by paying the required fee. The process involves submitting the First Information Report (F.I.R.) and undergoing police verification.

Examination Instructions for Students

Submission of Practical Record Notebook:

A minimum of 75% attendance is required for practicals, and students must submit their record notebooks. The same rules for theory examinations apply to absentees and failed candidates retaking the practical exams.

Fee Payment & Hall Ticket Procedures:

- Students must submit their filled Semester Examination Application Form (available at the COE Office or on the College Website).
- Examination fees must be paid through the Online Examination Fee Payment Portal.
- Students with attendance shortages who qualify for condonation must pay the required Condonation Fee to receive their Hall Tickets.
- After fee collection, the seating plan and Hall Tickets (with subject, date, time, hall number, and seat number) will be posted on the College website.
- Hall Tickets can be downloaded from the College Website by entering the roll number, exam month, and year.

Only students who have paid the examination fee can download their Hall Tickets and are eligible to sit for the exams.

Guidelines for Students inside the Examination Hall

1. Students must enter the exam hall at least 15 minutes before the scheduled time.
2. No student may leave the exam hall until the exam is finished.
3. Wearing an ID card is mandatory for both CIA and Semester Exams.
4. Possession of illicit materials, mobile phones, or smartwatches in the exam hall will be treated as malpractice.
5. Students must not offer or seek assistance from others during exams.
6. Students found guilty of malpractice will face severe consequences, including cancellation of all courses for that examination cycle, including practicals, fieldwork, and projects.
7. Students participating in national-level sports or events (e.g., NSS, NCC) representing the College must inform the CoE at least seven days before the event, with approval from the HoD and Principal.

- 1) The College will conduct Semester Examinations at the end of each semester.
- 2) If a student has not applied, he/she will not be permitted to attend the examination. Students must make themselves available at the time of the scheduled examination.
- 3) A student will be considered absent for the examination, if he/she is not available at the scheduled date & time of the examination.

- 4) A person admitted to the examination room, whether a student or scribe, must comply with all the requirements and directions of the invigilators.

- 5) A student, having entered the examination room, must not communicate, by word, writing, signalling or otherwise, with any person, or assist any other person to communicate with another student, or willingly receive communication from any person, other than an invigilator or examiner.
- 6) A person, whether a student or scribe, must not do anything intended to assist a student sitting for an examination to commit a breach of academic integrity or misconduct.
- 7) Any student suspected of committing a breach of academic integrity or misconduct will be dealt with under the Student Breach of Academic Integrity Procedures and the decision taken in the Examinations Discipline Committee will be the final.

Error Correction in Name in Mark Statement

1. To correct the spelling or the proper sequence of the name which are not due to data entry errors, the student shall present a copy of his/ her Secondary School Certificate /Higher Secondary Marks Statement/Transfer certificate.
2. Any errors in the Name of candidates printed in the Marks Statement/ Certificate/ Hall Ticket may be brought to the notice of COE for necessary correction with appropriate evidence.

Transcripts

Transcripts are issued to students on demand and on payment of prescribed amount to pursue their higher studies abroad from the Office of the Controller of Examinations duly signed by the Principal and Controller of Examinations.
