THE REPORT OF THE INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of our College is committed to quality and excellence. It channelises all the initiatives of the Institution towards for promoting academic and administrative excellence. It develops a heightened level of clarity and focus on institutional functioning. It coordinates internal communication to facilitate greater policy implementation and quality assurance in the interest of its stakeholders. Every year, the IQAC collects feedback responses from students, parents and other stakeholders on quality-related institutional processes. It organises Skill Development Programme for Teaching and the Non-Teaching staff and coordinates the Inter and Intra-Institutional Workshops and Seminars conducted in the College. The IQAC prepares the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) of the College based on the quality parameters and assessment criteria developed by the relevant quality assurance body in the prescribed format.

NAAC ACCREDITATION (Cycle IV)

The accreditation given by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) is regarded as a quality standard for assessing an Institution's Excellence in terms of offering Quality Education and Service. Sadakathullah Appa College, being one of the premier Higher Education Institution in the Southern Tamil Nadu, applied for Reaccreditation in the IV Cycle.

The Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA) was approved on 23.06.2022. The Self-Study Report was submitted on 06.08.2022. The Student Satisfaction Survey was completed on 29.08.2022 followed by the completion of Data Validation and Verification on 02.09.2022.

The College conducted two Mock Visits with the support of External Experts. The First Mock Visit was conducted on 28.01.2023. Dr. M. G. Sethuraman, Former Director of IQAC and Professor of Chemistry, Gandhigram Rural Institute (DU), Gandhigram, Tamil Nadu and Dr. P. Thirumavalavan, Former Registrar, Bharathiar University and presently the Registrar, Noorul Islam University, Thuckalay, Kumaracoil, served as External Experts. The Second Mock Visit was conducted on 08.03.2023 with External Experts Dr. M. G. Sethuraman, Former Director of IQAC and Professor of Chemistry, Gandhigram Rural Institute (DU), Gandhigram, Tamil Nadu; Prof. V. Vinod Kumar, Dean, Faculty of Languages and Head of the Department of English, Bharathidasan University, Trichy and Dr. B.Vanitha, Professor, Department of Economics, Bharathiar University, Coimbatore.

The NAAC PEER TEAM Members visited our College on 16.03.2023 and 17.03.2023. The PEER TEAM comprised the Chairperson Dr. Siba Prasad Adhikary, Former Vice-Chancellor, Fakir Mohan University, Khordha, Bhubaneswar, Orissa; the Member Coordinator Dr. Suresha Kithur Veerabhadrapa, Former Principal, JSS College for Women (Autonomous), Saraswathipuram, Mysuru, Karnataka and the Member Dr. Rachna Verma Mohan, Professor, Department of Education, Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University, South West Delhi. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) approved the report submitted by the PEER TEAM Members and declared the result on 21.03.2023. With the Grace of Almighty, our College has been Reaccredited by NAAC at an A++ Grade with a CGPA of 3.56 in the IV Cycle (**Annexure I**).

The Activities of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell:

1. The IQAC Steering Committee Meeting was organized on 16.12.2022 and 26.05.2023.

2. A Programme on the topic “The Designing of Course Outcomes and the Setting of Outcome-Focused Questions” was conducted on 22.11.2022. Mr. Ajay Bhagwat, Director, Inpods India Private Limited, Pune, India, was the Chief Guest.
3. The Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) for the academic year 2020-2021 was submitted on 12.03.2023.
4. An Administrative Audit was conducted for the Administrative Offices, the Library, the IQAC, and for Part V Programmes on 10.10.2022, and an Academic Audit was conducted for all the Departments on 11.10.2022. Dr.V.Balamurugan, Director, Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli, and Dr. William Dharma Raja, Dean, Faculty of Education, Manonmaniam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli, served as the External Auditors.
5. A Feedback on Faculty was received from the students on 06.03.2023.
6. A Feedback on Curriculum was also collected from the students on 10.11.2022 and 10.04.2023 (**Annexure II**).

7. Research Activities:

- Sadakathullah Appa College is offering 9 Research Programmes in Arts, Sciences and Humanities.
- 95 Faculty Members are Doctorates, of which 53 teachers are approved Research Supervisors.
- 148 scholars are pursuing their Ph.D. Programmes in various disciplines as Part-Time and Full-Time Scholars.
- A token honorarium of Rs.1,000/- per research paper is being given to the Faculty Members for their publications in Scopus and WoS Indexed Journals. In the academic year 2021- 2022, an amount of Rs.46,000/-has been distributed to 26 Faculty Members.

➤ **Doctoral Degrees awarded to our Faculty Members:**

Mrs. A. Zeenath Bazeera, Head, Postgraduate Department of Physics; Ms. Ed. Priyadarshini, Department of Commerce, Mrs. U. Jerseena, Head Department of Mathematics (Unaided) and Mr. M. Sathick Ali, Head, Department of Tamil (Unaided) have been awarded Ph.D. in the academic year 2023 - 2024 (**Annexure III**).

➤ **Ph.D. Degrees awarded under the Supervision of our Faculty Members:**

A total of 14 research scholars have been awarded Ph.D. under the supervision of our Faculty Members in the academic year 2023-2024 (**Annexure IV**).

57 of our Faculty Members have published Books and contributed Chapters in Books (**Annexure V**).

The total number of papers published in National / International Journals by our Faculty is 74 (**Annexure VI**).

8. Best Practices

In pursuit of fulfilling the Vision and Mission of the Founders, the College has some unique best practices to serve students and society.

i) Students Self Help Scheme (SSHS):

Students Self-Help Scheme (SSHS) is in place for the last eleven years. This scheme is appreciated by many as it eases the pressures of economically disadvantaged students. Under this scheme each student pays a sum of Rs. 20/- per semester and volunteered to help poor and needy students. The amount collected under this scheme this year was Rs. 76,000/- and it was distributed to 38 economically underprivileged students (**Annexure VII**).

ii) Students Help In First Aid (SHIFA):

A sum of Rs. 39,000/- has been collected under this scheme and it has been distributed to 12 needy students to meet their medical expenses this year **(Annexure VII)**.

iii) Manitham:

A Philanthropic Movement called *MANITHAM*, which has been functioning in the Institution since 2016, is doing a noble service to the destitute person, homeless and unattended people in the Palayamkottai, Tirunelveli, regions. They are provided with food, dress, footwears and bed sheets. There is a separate WhatsApp Group with the Principal as the admin to carry out the charity. The Students' Council is the working force behind this Philanthropic Scheme.

On November 14th of 2022, Magdalene Matriculation School and Sadakathullah Appa College jointly celebrated the Children's Day. The Management of Magdalene Matriculation School provided food to the destitute person and homeless people. The Students volunteered with a selfless concern for the well-being of the needy.

On December 30th of 2022, our College got the "Meritorious Achievement Award" (நற்பணி சாதனையாளர் விருது) for the outstanding contributions of the *Manitham* Team from Tmt. Vijila Sathyananth, Former Member of Rajya Sabha, in a programme organized by "Nellai Life".

H. Sabeek Aswan, Chairperson of the Students' Council and D.G. Ravi Krishnan, Secretary of the Students' Council distributed food and blankets to the homeless people on 19th of February, 2022, 29th of January, 2023 and 3rd of March, 2023.

iv) Earn While You Learn Scheme:

Considering the poor economic status of many of our students and to promote work culture, the College introduced the **Earn While You Learn Scheme**. The remuneration given to them is Rs. 100/- per

day. They serve in the College Office, the Library, the Book Depot, the Auditorium, the Attendance Department, the Office of the IQAC and the Chemistry Laboratory. A total of 26 students from Shift I and Shift II Programmes have been deputed to work in various Offices, Departments and Laboratories (**Annexure VII**).

9. Proforma of Application for Extension of Autonomous Status

The Proforma of Application for Extension of Autonomous Status was submitted to the UGC on 26.05.2023. An Action-Taken Report on the Recommendations of the UGC Expert Committee for the Second Extension of Autonomous Status (Visit Date: 11.07.2018 to 13.07.2018) is enclosed in **Annexure VIII**.

- Enhancement of counselling and guidance facilities for Competitive exam, Banking, Tamil Nadu State Public Service Commission and NET/SLET examination.
- To get funding through research projects from various Government agencies like DST/DBT/CSIR/ICSSR/MOEF-CC etc.

Focussing to become an educational hub for startups.

Challenges:
