1.4.2 How the feedback obtained is being analyzed and utilized for overall development of the institution?

The institution collects feedback from the stakeholders such as the students, alumni and parents. The students are electronically administered a questionnaire containing 25 questions focusing on the performance of a particular teacher who have taught them a specific subject and their feedback is collected confidentially. The students are to provide the feedback on a four point scale where 4 being very good and 1 being poor. The feedback is consolidated in a secure server and an overall percentage is given for a particular teacher. Then the teachers are ranked according to the percentage received. The individual teacher's feedback is shared with them confidentially. Moreover, a Feedback Analysis Committee comprising two members – Prof. K. Rabi Ahamed and Dr. M. Kamalutheen analyse the feedback further and based on the ranking the teachers who are in the last three positions are given personal counselling to improve their teaching and other relevant areas so that they can improve their overall feedback score. The overall report is also submitted to the management committee. Feedback from the alumni is also collected using a questionnaire. The feedback is consolidated and a report is prepared. A similar process is followed in the case of the parents also. But the questionnaires issued to the parents are in the regional language (Tamil) so that they can understand the question and give genuine feedback. The feedback provided by the parents is consolidated and a report is prepared. Both these reports are submitted to the Management Committee and actions are taken accordingly.

The infrastructure of our College keeps pace with its academic growth. For its smooth and systematic conduct, the College has its own procedures and policies for maintaining and utilizing the physical, academic and support facilities.

Library:

The College Library plays its role as a provider of information and facilitator to learning. It imparts a conducive environment for intellectual nourishment by providing user-focused services. The Library is fully automated. The ID cards and books of staff and students are pasted with bar-coded labels. Student entry is through e-gate. AutoLib library software is used to issue books. Books can be searched through OPAC. A special website is created for the convenience of students (http://www.sadakathlibrary magazine.webs.com/) to inform them about the library working hours, resources available at the library, recent events conducted by the library and list of newspapers, magazines and journals. An Internet café with seven computers and an e-library with fifteen computers are available on the campus. The library has created "Student Readers Forum" and "Forum for Civil Service Aspirants". The activities of the students inside the library premises is monitored by CCTV cameras. The library conducts orientation programmes for the freshers every year. It also organizes national seminars, workshops, conferences and book exhibitions every year.

Computing Facility:

All the Departments, the Computer Laboratories, the Language Laboratory, the e- Library, the Audio-Visual Hall, the Library, the e- Conference Hall, the Seminar Hall, the Internet Browsing Centre, the Offices of the Principal, the Controller of Examinations, the Deans, the IQAC Co-ordinator, the Director of Physical Education, the Managing Committee, Attendance Section, Book Depot, the Centre for Research and the College Office have been provided with sufficient number of Computers. LAN facility is available on the Campus. All the Departments and the Offices have been provided with Wi-Fi modems. Propriety softwares such as Autolib, Zebra Designer, Tally ERP 9, Gaussian 09, Clarity S-Net and three in-house built software and Open Source softwares such as Pyrex and Chemsketch are available in the College.

The Language Laboratory facilitates online teaching with the introduction of Computer -Assisted Language Learning Courses in Listening & Speaking and Reading & Writing. Online teaching is done using the Internet facility available in the Departments. A provision is available in the e-Library for the teachers, the research scholars and the PG students to access to N-LIST and INFLIBNET. The students make use of the Internet facility available in the Library and Departments. The air-conditioned e-Conference Hall has been

adequately equipped with an LCD projector and the Internet facility for online teaching. The Seminar Hall has the facility to promote teaching -learning and research activities.

The College has 20 ICT- enabled classrooms, an e-Library, an e-Conference Hall, two Seminar Halls, a Language Laboratory and an Audio-Visual Hall which are put to optimum use for enhancing the quality of teaching and learning. These learning spaces are also utilized for organizing Guest Lectures, Seminars, Conferences, Workshops, Training Programmes, Inter-Collegiate Academic Festivals and Recruitments Drives.

Our College is an Institutional Member of the ICT Academy of Tamil Nadu. Our teachers have participated in the Computer Literacy Awareness Programmes organized by the ICTACT, Chennai.

The Management has appointed two full-time system administrators and one Hardware Technician for the maintenance of Computers and their accessories. Apart from this, the College also utilizes the services of the external Hardware Professionals whenever needed. The UPSs are maintained under AMC. The College allocates sufficient funds under the AMC for the maintenance of Computers. It also uses the fund sanctioned by the UGC under Equipment Maintenance Grant.

Classrooms:

The College runs 33 programmes under Aided and Unaided categories and it puts to optimum use, its 55 classrooms by conducting classes in two shifts. Accordingly, it utilizes 46 classrooms in shift-I and 42 in shift-II. Apart from this 14 Add-on courses are conducted in shift-II on Wednesdays and Thursdays and Spoken English classes on Mondays and Tuesdays. The incubation centre by name 'The Raja Block' facilitates the conduct of typewriting classes with the assistance of DOTE (Department of Technical Education) with 64 typewriters, to provide hands-on training to students from programmes like B.Com (Aided and Unaided), B.Com. Finance and B.Com. C.A. A Tailoring Course also conducted in the incubation centre on Mondays and Fridays for the first-year students and Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays for the second-year students in four batches, each batch containing twenty students each. Also Yoga, which has been incorporated in the curriculum under Part-V, is conducted in the Indoor Stadium, once in a week in every B order, during the 5th hour (12.10 p.m. – 1.10 p.m.).

Laboratory facilities:

The College maintains laboratory facilities and equipment in a safe operating condition and ensures that all laboratory procedures and experiments are conducted in a safe and prudent manner. The departments of Physics, Chemistry, Zoology, Computer Science, Nutrition and Dietetics, Microbiology and English have their own laboratories in their respective wings. All the laboratories comply with the regulations relating to ventilation systems, environmental controls and other exhaust devices. The computerized English Language Laboratory with one server and forty computers, supported by clarity S-NET facilitates the Department in the introduction of Computer Aided Language Learning (CALL) courses in Listening & Speaking and Reading & Writing as SBE and NME papers. The Audio Visual Hall with a TV, LCD projector and motorized screen

enables the conduct of the course 'A Course in Spoken English'.

The maintenance of the buildings, the classrooms and the laboratories are taken care of by a maintenance Engineer and a full -time building Supervisor. The College has also appointed supervisors, electricians, plumbers, carpenters, laboratory assistants, technical assistants, gardeners, sweepers, scavengers and markers for the maintenance of infrastructure facilities, equipment and for the upkeep of the campus.

5.3.2 Activity of Student Council & representation of students on academic & administrative bodies/committees of the institution (maximum 500 words) Hema

Healthy institutions go by unanimous decision. Students, one of the stakeholders, are therefore given due representation in academic and administrative bodies of our College. The activities of the Students' Council in our College are very remarkable. It comprises of a Chairman, Vice-chairman, Secretary and Joint Secretary. The office bearers are elected by the class representatives on the day of the election. Every year the College conducts election through e-voting in a democratic way. Female students are favoured with 50% reservation.

The College supports the establishment and ongoing development of the Students' Council in all ways possible. The office bearers are given representation in Academic Council, were they play their role in the improvement of academic status and development of policies in a number of areas. The Alumni too are favoured with representation in the Board of Studies Meetings.

Whenever there arises a need for fund-raising towards supporting the victims of natural havocs, the Students' Council gives a helping hand. Thus it raised funds for the Uttarkhand and Kashmir flood disasters in 2013, Cuddalore and Chennai flood disasters in 2017 and Kerala flood disaster and Gaja cyclonic storm disaster in 2018. During the Keral floods relief materials worth Rs. 10,00,000/- were collected by the Students' Council and were handed over to the District Collector Pathanamthitta of Kerala by our Principal on 24.08.2018. For the Gaja cyclonic storm havoc, the Principal, accompanied by a team of student and staff volunteers went to the storm-affected areas and handed over the relief materials for an estimate of Rs. 2,58,136/-.

Curriculum Development Cell is a vital part of the College Autonomy, with two designated deans appointed by the Management. Our Management has given the Cell full liberty in curriculum designing which involves the framing of general course scheme and scheme of examinations for all U.G., P.G. and M.Phil courses guidelines. It is also free to formulate teaching and evaluation strategies.

The College Council supports the Principal in his day-to-day ventures. It rises to the occasion during emergency situations like unanticipated holidays and student related problems. The Academic Calendar of the college is laid out by this Council. The opening day and the last working day of a semester is also resolved by this council. The other distinct activities of the College are also administered by this Council.

6.2 Strategy Development and Deployment

6.2.1 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following (with in 100 words each):

Curriculum Development

The Boards of Studies meetings are periodically conducted for the revamping of the syllabi. A total of 83 seminars, conferences and symposia have been arranged. Innovative papers such as Computer Assisted Language Learning, A Practical Course in Spoken English etc. are offered. The Choice Based Credit System facilitates the offering of Skill Based Electives, Elective Paper, Non-Major Elective, Value Education, Environmental Sciences, Part-V programmes, Career Oriented Programmes, Add-On-Courses and Project for UG / PG Students.

Teaching and Learning

Sixty-three staff members are Ph.D. holders, among which, 38 are approved guides. The College has 23 ICT-enabled classrooms, 6 Smart classrooms, an Audio-Visual Hall, a Language Lab, an e-Library and an e-Conference Hall. The Department of Zoology maintains a museum with 670 specimens. The College has a herbal garden with 78 plant species. The Department of Business Administration periodically conducts Group-Discussions. The College provides OD for presenting papers and serving as resource persons at seminars, conferences and workshops.

The College has introduced many innovative schemes: 'Earn While You Learn', Students' Self-Help Scheme

(SSHS), Students' Help in First Aid (SHIFA) and 'Manitham' – a public-spirited humanitarian movement

Examination and Evaluation

We follow the 25:75 internal – external patterns for theory papers. There is no passing minimum in the internal. We follow the 40:60 internal-external pattern for practicals. Three Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) tests with one hour duration are conducted per semester. Each CIA is for 20 marks. Average of the best two is taken.

The valuation is done by external examiners alone. However, the Chairperson of each board is the senior internal faculty. We follow single valuation system for UG and double valuation for PG and M.Phil courses.

Research and Development

Research activities contribute to the fundamentals of various sciences and also the understanding of socially relevant issues. Research Promotion Committee (RPC) has been in place. Teachers in the departments of Tamil, English, Chemistry, Commerce, Computer Science, History, Mathematics, Microbiology, Library & Information Science, Physics and Zoology have guided research scholars. At present, 104 scholars are working under 38 research supervisors in different disciplines.

Apart from the research guides, research coordinators have been appointed. They motivate and inspire the staff members to pursue researce. They inculcate the urge for research among the staff members, research scholars and graduates. They direct and help the staff members in receiving grants from various funding agencies. They help in the Ph.D admission procedures. They conduct course work examinations and support the eligible staff members to avail guideship from the university. They organize orientation programmes, workshops and seminars to enhance quality research. They insist staff members to publish articles with high impact in highly reputed national and international journals.

As a result of the efforts taken by the research departments, the College has to its credit many research publications in national and international peer-reviewed Journals.

Library, ICT and Physical Infrastructure / Instrumentation

The College has a fully automated library with facilities such as e-Gate, bar-code scanning, AutoLib Library Software, OPAC and Inflibnet/N-list. There is a browsing centre with seven computers. There are 55 classrooms, 7 UG Science Laboratories, 2 UG Computer Science Laboratories, 3 PG Science Laboratories and 1 PG Computer Science Laboratory. The sports gallery, the indoor stadium, tennis courts, solar lamps, rain water harvest, two ramps for physically challenged students, RO water facility, multigym are some of the recent enhancements. In addition to that, the College has 1 Cricket / Football Ground, 1 Basketball Ground, 2 Tennis Courts, 1 Athletic Track, 1 Hockey Ground, 1 Kho-Kho Ground, 1 Kabaddi Court and 1 Ball Badminton Court. The Boys Hostel has 56 rooms. The Girls' Hostel I and II have 18 halls each.

Human Resource Management

The students are engaged by the Ph.D scholars during the free hours. Sometimes they are sent to the auditorium and are made to watch educational videos. They are also sent to the library.

The staff members of the first shift extend their services to the second shift students and the staff members of

the second shift extend their services to the first shift students. Both the first and second shift staff members conduct Add-on courses and Spoken English classes. The staff members are chosen as the conveners and coordinators of various committees in the College. The Staff members are deployed in the Placement cell, the Book Depot, the College Canteen and the College Hostels.

Industry Interaction and Collaboration

The College maintains tie with the ICT Academy and conducts various programmes for the development of the institution. The ICT and Sadakathullah Appa College conducted a Faculty Development Programme on Creative Thinking. An elocution competition, 'Youth Talk 2018' has also been conducted by the ICT.

Admission of Students

Admission of students into UG, PG and M.Phil. Courses is on merit basis. Applications are invited from eligible candidates for admission into various courses. After the receipt of filled-in applications, the data is entered in the computer with the help of a specially designed software, and the merit list is generated. As our College is a Muslim Minority Institution, 50% of the seats are allotted to the Muslim Community and the remaining 50% are filled as per the guidelines of the Government of Tamil Nadu. Steps to implement online admissions are being taken.

6.2.2 : Implementation of e-governance in areas of operations:

Planning and Development

The Academic Planner was approved by the Governing Board in March 2017. Online entry of the internal marks is practiced effectively. The Staff Profile and Department Profile are computerized and uploaded on the College website.

Administration

SMS facility is available to notify the absence of the students to their parents. Whatsapp groups are formed to share information. The offices of the Principal, the Controller of Examinations, the Deans, the Managing Committee and the college Administrative block are computerized. Thirty CCTV cameras have been installed to ensure effective campus monitoring. A Public Address system is operational. e-attendance has been introduced for the security staff.

Finance and Accounts

The students practise online fee payment. Computerized receipts are preferred to old ones. The Financial section in the COE and Committee offices are computerized. PFMS is being followed effectively.

Student Admission and Support

The issue of application for admission into courses and payment of fees have been made online. The attendance of the students is uploaded on the College website every day. Internal and Assignment marks are entered online. Results are published online.

Examination

The marks of the CIA examinations are collected from the respective teachers online within a week after the tests are over. Students pay the Examination fee online and the results are published on our College website.

In way of constantly encouraging the students to be compassionate members of the community, the College has evolved many practices like Earn While You Learn, SSHS, SHIFA and *Manitham*. Two of the above best practices are dealt with below.

SSHS

A scheme namely, **Students' Self-Help Scheme** (**SSHS**), has been in practice in our College. As per this scheme, economically disadvantaged students are being provided with need-based financial assistance from the amount collected every month from the volunteers. Each student pays a sum of Rs.10/- per month voluntarily to help the poor and needy students. This scheme has been appreciated by many as it eases the pressure of the economically disadvantaged students. The amount collected under this scheme this year in the Aided section is Rs. 75,000/- and the total beneficiaries are 25.

SHIFA

Another best practice followed in this institution is SHIFA, 'Students' Help In First Aid' – monitory help by the students for the first aid during accidents. An amount of Rs. 18,976/- has been collected under this scheme and the total beneficiaries are 17. The amount will be at disposal for the medical requirements of needy students.

The destiny of a nation is shaped inside its classrooms, the College takes every measure to produce students who are intellectually committed and spiritually inspired. Whatever the College endeavours to accomplish, it has its Vision behind, as a motivating factor: "to provide quality higher education to all... to inculcate the students with spiritual and moral values... producing good and useful citizens worthy of the great land". As such, the College grooms its students as better citizens with not only intellectual capital but also moral capital. Discipline and Placement are the two areas, distinctive to its vision, priority and thrust.

The College conducts *Deeniyath* classes for Muslim students & Moral Science classes for Non-Muslim students every Wednesdays. For the conduct of *Deeniyath* classes, resource persons are availed from outside. In these classes, awareness has been created among the students to abide by the moral standards of our nation. Strict dress code is followed by the students as well as the staff. Uniform has been introduced to the students. Student attendance is also monitored very strictly and the parents of the absentees are informed of the absence of their

ward at the very first hour itself. Also students who absent themselves for genuine reasons during the CIA examinations are favoured with a retest. The rapport between the administrative heads and the Students' Council is very remarkable and there has been no strike organized by the students for the past nine years.

The College pays great attention towards the well-being of the inmates of the two ladies hostels. Safety of the inmates has been ensured by maintaining various registers, having regular contacts with their parents, keeping records of their entry and exit, installing CCTV cameras at the hostel gates and vigilance at the College main gate. Details about the holidays and the departure of the inmates from the hostel during holidays are informed to their parents through Whatsapp messages from the College Office.

The College encourages the education of the economically deprived students by offering scholarships from various endowments and Zakat Fund collected by the Islamic Study Circle. 105 endowments amounting to Rs.40,00,000/- have been sponsored by the well-wishers and retired staff members. In addition, there are 50 patrons who have donated a sum of Rs.63,50,800/-.

In way of creating self employment opportunities for the students, the College offers hands-on training on tailoring, typewriting, water-soil analyses, silkworm-rearing and taxidermy.

The College nurtures social awareness and accountability in the young minds at the right time by evolving schemes like *Manitam*, a humanitarian and public-spirited movement initiated with a noble intention of identifying and providing shelter and food for the abandoned and mentally-deranged people in an around Tirunelveli.

Thus the College ascribes great importance to schemes & policies that uplift the standard of a student both in academic and personal fronts.

8. Future Plans of action for the next academic year

- 6. To promote NPTEL courses in the college.
- 7. To take action on the feedback obtained from the students.
- 8. To introduce evaluation pattern for all Part-V programmes.
- 9. To apply for "Abhiyan" scheme.
- 10. To offer mentoring service to non-accredited institutions in the neighbourhood.
- 11. To vary the standard of question papers as per the ability of the students.
- 12. To frame different Part II English syllabi to cater to the diverse needs of the students.
- 13. To issue different sets of question papers to students, writing the examination in the same hall.
- 14. To encourage the staff members to create PPTs and upload it on the College websites.
- 15. To encourage the students to submit e-assignments.
- 16. To award a maximum of 5 marks to students in CIA tests for the utilization of Library.
- 17. To establish a common instrumentation centre for all the science departments.
- 18. To maintain question banks for at least 5 courses per programme.
- 19. To initiate the preparatory work for the NAAC reaccreditation with an aim of attaining "A+" grade with more than a CGPA score of 3.5..
- 20. To secure a rank between the 100th and 150th positions in 2019, between the 50th and 100th in 2020 and within the first 25 in 2021, in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF).
- 21. To upload the time-table on the college website.
- 22. To suggest appointing only qualified faculty as per the UGC norms.
- 23. Curriculum with learning outcomes to be uploaded on the College website.
- 24. To provide ruled booklets (24, 36 pages) for the students to write the examinations.
- 25. To fully computerize the Controller of Examinations Office.
- 26. To offer consultancy services on behalf of the departments and to sign MoUs.
- 27. To introduce uniform to the II and III year UG and II Year PG students.
- 28. To provide institutional Log-in IDs for all the staff members.
